






NSW Biosecurity (Invasive Ant Carriers) Control Order

- Specifies entry conditions for carrier materials coming from within 5 km of the known infested area in QLD
- Different conditions depending on carrier material
- Requirements in place since 2002
- Separate to the QLD requirements

Map of the known infested area in QLD



Biosecurity (Invasive Ant Carriers) Control Order

Regulated fire ant carrier materials include:

- Baled material (hay, sugarcane mulch)
- Mining and quarrying materials
- Potted plants
- Organic mulch
- Turf
- Agricultural and earthmoving equipment
- Soil and anything with soil in it



Checklist for buying hay from south-east Queensland



- it comes from outside the fire ant biosecurity zones, and
- it comes with a vendor declaration

If it comes from inside the fire ant biosecurity zones:

- it comes with a Plant Health Certificate stating:
- it's been chemically treated (fumigated) for fire ants, and
- it's been stored off the ground and under cover, and
- it's dry and free of soil


+ Agricultural and earth moving equipment

To move agricultural and earth moving equipment into NSW from or through the fire ant biosecurity zones in Queensland it must be accompanied by a <u>Plant Health Certificate</u> that certifies it has been:

 inspected and found to be free from fire ants, soil and other materials such as hay, straw, turf or mulch 48 hours prior to dispatch.

Tweed & Kyogle engagement

- Letter box drop (40,000 Tweed, 4000 Kyogle)
- Media releases (jointly with Councils)
- Social media campaign

Keep the Tweed free of fire ants

Look for nests that are:

- flattish patches of soil or mounds up to 40 cm high, with no obvious entrance holes
- loose or crumbly looking, with a honeycomb appearance inside

Look for ants that are:

- dark reddish-brown with a darker brown-black abdomen
- different sizes in the one nest (between 2 and 6 mm long)
- aggressive, swarming out of the nest if gently poked with a stick

Check:

- sunny, open areas of lawn or pasture, areas of disturbed soil
- gardens, backyards, parks, roadsides, paddocks, fence lines, cropped land
- where hay, turf, mulch, soil, potted plants, sand, gravel or agricultural machinery has been used or stored, especially if it came from southeast Queensland

If you see nests or ants like this or you've been stung multiple times and the stings form white pustules, call us.

Toolbox talks with staff and councillors



Actions councils can take

- Assist DPI by amplifying our key messages through social media and council websites
- Be alert to the risk associated of the movement of fire ant carrier materials into local council areas
- Be aware of movement requirements
- Have outdoor staff aware of what to look for and how to report suspect nests
- Work with the DPI Fire ant response to ensure communities are aware of the risk and actions required
- Add an advisory note to Development Approvals that the Control Order applies to material movements



Check for fire ants





CHECK:

- Open sunny areas like lawns, parks, paddocks and disturbed ground
- Where hay, turf, soil, sand, gravel, mulch or potted plants have been used or stored



Fire ants attack and sting over and over

LOOK FOR:

- ☐ Nest mounds or patches of soil up to 40 cm high, with no obvious entrance holes
- Aggressive ants, swarming from the nest if gently prodded with a long stick
- Small, dark reddish-brown ants with darker black abdomens
- 2-6 mm long and a range of sizes within a nest
